Fitness Connection to open at previous grocery site

Renovation is now underway at 6750 Forest Hill Drive for a Fitness Connection. Renovation cost is \$3.5 million. Fitness Connection strives to make a high-quality fitness experience attainable for all by offering all-inclusive ame-

nities starting at a low monthly cost of just \$10 a month. They plan to be open by January 1, 2020.

Amenities available to all members at the impressive Forest Hill location will include an expansive workout floor complete with free weights, and rows of cardio and strength equipment, Group Classes in a premiere Group Fitness Studio, a designated Group Cycling Studio, a turf training area with a functional training rig, full-size basketball courts, men and women's locker rooms complete with saunas, and a kid's club with tablets, a mini basketball court and theater.

From the City Council...

Regular City Council Meeting - August 6, 2019

- Radi Khader, owner of ABC Auto, passed away and his son accepted a proclamation from Mayor Joubert in honor of his service to the community.
- Specific Use Permits for on Premise Alcoholic Beverage Consumption were approved for Pollo Maya Restaurant, 3344 Mansfield Highway, and Milo's Mexican Restaurant, 6950 Forest Hill Drive.
- A zoning change from Single Family Residential to Light Industrial requested by the Forest Hill Community Bible Church was denied.
- An ordinance regulating businesses that dispose of used motor oil was unanimously passed.
- An ordinance adopting the 2018 International Building Code and the 2017 National Electric Code.were unanimously passed.
- An ordinance amending the premit fee schedule did not pass.
- A display plaque at Anglin Park was unanimously approved in memory of Fred and Mary Stead who donated the land.

Regular City Council Meeting - August 20, 2019

- The first public hearing on the 2019-2020 budget was held at 6 p.m.
- An interlocal agreement between Fort Worth Independent School District for a school resource officer was approved.
- An ordinanceto remove the requirement for a Specific Use Permit for Flea Market aIndoor and Flea Market Outdoor uses was approved.
- A request to allow a guest house to be built in the rear of 4900 Alandale which was approved by the Planning & Zoning Commission passed after action by the Council.
- Two structures were ordered to be demolished following a public hearing 2900 Mansfield Highway and 5905 Forest Haven.
- A Mayor's Youth Advisory Council was established.
- A contract for IT management services was approved.
- Upfit (lights, radios, maekings) for four new police cars was approved.



"It is our intention to honor those heroes that arose from the tragedy that occurred in El Paso, collectively as a brotherhood, for their selfless and brave responses to the deadly and senseless shooting that ensued on August 3. As first responders, it is important to us to remind those affected by this travesty, that they are not alone and we stand behind them as they begin to heal."

Charles Yarbrough celebrated a birthday on July 15 but is now recovering from a triple heart bypass surgery. We wish him a quick recovery.




City receives Distinguished Budget Presentation Award for tenth year
